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About Our School

John F. Kennedy Elementary School presently serves approximately 550 students in grades 4K-5. The classes are heterogeneously grouped into single graded classrooms, whereby each teacher team is responsible for teaching all academic subjects, including: literacy, math, science, and social studies as well as Second Step curriculum (addressing social-emotional learning standards). Most students at Kennedy will identify with one homeroom teacher but also as a member of a team (three or four classrooms working together as a team).

Additionally, all students have the benefit of receiving weekly instruction in Related Arts classes to include: LMC/Technology, Library, Physical Education, Art and Music. 5th graders also participate in Strings class.

Key Policies and Guidelines

Attendance Matters!

Going to school EVERY DAY matters because key academic concepts are being taught – catching up on missed learning is very hard to do. MMSD has a 94% attendance goal which means students should not be absent for more than 10 days per school year. Our scholars begin their learning at 8:40 a.m.

Attendance in the early grades matters because students need enough time on task to learn basic academics. Students need to learn to read well enough to learn their other subjects.

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Elementary school lays the foundation for whether children will graduate or drop-out from high school. Your child needs to attend school everyday! Ask your child's teacher or our school social worker Bridget Cremin if you have questions.

Building Security

All visitors (parents, tutors, field trip chaperones, etc.) must request access to the building using the intercom system at the main entrance. Visitor passes are available in the main office. If you are picking up your student for an appointment, please come to the main office to sign them out and then they will be called from the classroom to meet in the office.

Picking up your child during the school day

We require parents to come into our office and sign out your student. We will call the classroom to have the student sent down to the office to meet the parents. Please remember anyone picking up a student must be authorized and listed in Infinite Campus. Once school is in session, no non-school staff (including parents) will be allowed to go to a classroom unaccompanied and pick up a child.

Positive Behavior Support

We embrace the Positive Behavior Support (PBIS) framework. We believe in directly teaching, reinforcing and reteaching the behaviors expected of our scholars. Our school-wide behavior expectations are:

- Be safe
- Be respectful
- Be responsible
- Be a learner.

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We have monthly PBIS assemblies that focus on a skill as a part of our school-wide expectations. Our kids lead the teaching and we celebrate our scholars. We will work to make sure that your child feels a sense of belonging within the classroom and school community. If you have concerns about your child's social emotional well-being, please contact our main office and ask to speak with our Social Worker, Bridget Cremin, our Assistant Principal, Vanessa Kent, or our Principal, Mandy Harvey.

Student Personal Property

Lost and found is located in the lower level in the cafeteria. Please check this frequently for missing items. Toys and playground equipment should stay at home. Make sure to label your child's belongings. It really helps!

Supervision of building/grounds

Our first bell rings at 8:25 to welcome students to school. Students come right into the building when they arrive. Students are able to get breakfast and take it to their classrooms. All students start their day in the classrooms for a Soft Landing and breakfast in classrooms to enjoy social connection time with classmates and their teacher. There is no supervision on the playground before or after school.

Traffic Safety, Parking, Pick Up/Drop Off Information

Only students who are 10 years old may ride bicycles to school unless there is a parent written request and approval through the principal. Families who are dropping off and picking up students can refer to the traffic brochure available in the main office and online. For the safety of our students, the parking lot is for staff only, not to be used for pick up/drop off. Families can park on neighborhood streets following posted signs or pull up in the designated drop-off zone on Meadowlark Dr in front of the green space north of the school. Our handicap accessible parking spots are in our parking lot. You must have a permit to enter. There is no drop-off/pick-up in the front of the school. That space is reserved for our buses and vans.
